The greatest expression of love is to share an accurate message of salvation.

- Once Christ ascends to heaven the disciples begin to anticipate His return.
- Philip sees himself as aligning with prophecies of the Old Testament. (Jer. 50:4).
- The Ethiopian Eunuch was aware of the Hebrew faith and worshiped God. Acts 8:27).
- Isaiah 53 presents a clear message of why Jesus died on the cross. (Acts 8:32-33).
- The message of salvation always requires a response on behalf of the lost. (Acts 8:36-39).
- Philip ends his life sharing the gospel with one community for over 20 years. (Acts 21:8).
- Every believer is uniquely positioned in life to help people begin, renew or grow in their relationship with Jesus.

Application:

- How are you clarifying the message of salvation to those around you?
- Are you living in a way that will attract others to a relationship with Christ?
- How can you be more gracious to those who misunderstand the Gospel?
- How can you help other believers renew or grow their relationship with Christ?
